

## **SAFETY STANDARDS**

HOTEL BELLEVUE HAS BEEN RENOVATED ACCORDING TO HIGH SAFETY STANDARDS AND IS EQUIPPED WITH THE LATEST DEVICES FOR FIRE PREVENTION, DETECTION, AND EXTINCTION.

In case of fire or any other emergency, the hotel staff is trained in emergency procedures, so we kindly ask you to calmly follow their instructions. Please be careful and vigilant to prevent the occurrence of fires. Familiarize yourself with the emergency exits and paths, which are indicated on the entrance doors of your room. By acting responsibly, you contribute to your own safety as well as the safety of other guests and hotel employees.

### **IN CASE OF FIRE OR SMOKE IN THE ROOM**

- Call the Reception at 8009, state your room number, and provide a clear description of what is happening.
- If the room is filled with smoke, cover your mouth, nose, and eyes with a damp napkin or towel. Leave the room and close the door behind you.
- Follow the signs on the corridors marked in green.
- Do not use the elevator, as it will stop in case of danger; use the stairs, as indicated on the evacuation plan.

### **FIRE ALARM**

- If the door is not hot, open it carefully, leave the room, and head towards the nearest evacuation exit.
- Take the key with you so you can return to your room if the evacuation route is blocked.
- If the corridor is filled with smoke, cover your mouth, nose, and eyes with a damp napkin or towel.
- When escaping through smoky corridors, crouch down, as the smoke is less dense near the floor. Follow the signs on the corridors clearly marked in green.
- Do not use the elevator, as it will stop in case of danger; use the stairs, as indicated on the evacuation plan.
- Pay attention to the instructions of the responsible person when the fire alarm sounds.

## **STAYING IN THE ROOM**

- If the door is hot, do not open it; stay in your room, as it is the safest place for you. Call Reception at 8009 and tell them your location.
- Remain calm and wait for further instructions.
- Prevent smoke from entering the room. Use damp towels, bed linens, or clothing to seal the door and ventilation openings. Wet fabric is a good filter for breathing; place it over your nose and mouth. We recommend filling the bathtub with water to dampen fabrics and to pour water over doors and walls (use the bathroom wastebasket).
- Do not break windows unless necessary, as the glass can protect you from smoke. Stand by the window to be visible from the outside.
- Stay composed. Staff and firefighters are trained for emergencies.

## **PREVENTING THE START OF A FIRE**

- Do not smoke in indoor areas of the hotel! Smoking in rooms is strictly prohibited!
- Do not empty ashtrays into the wastebasket!
- Do not leave electrical appliances, lit candles, or similar items that could cause a fire unattended!
